Centennial Planting

4-Way Lake/Lincoln intersection

Lynne \$10,000 in funds refunded from the DOT for the stoplights could be appropriated to a study of the intersection. Assembly vote is required and will be on agenda for next assembly meeting.

Barth provided a draft scope of work for discussion:

The stoplight intersection at Lake and Lincoln is the first impression most visitors get after disembarking from their lightering boats.

The current sidewalk by the intersection does not tie in well with other pathways and should be improved for pedestrian accessibility.

People do not use the crosswalk provided and the flow of pedestrians is too high at times for the size of the area.

Removing the street parking at the intersection across from the MacDonald building could create opportunities for plantings and help traffic flow.

Signage improvements at the corner should be made.

Paving around intersection should have unifying effect.

Memorial Tree Planting:

In the event that a tree has to be removed or dies it would be better that it is not associated with an individual. Instead of having individual markers for each memorial, a single memorial with multiple names will be placed near the tree plantings.
