BALLOT PROPOSITION

PROPOSITION NO. 1

SUMMARY:

In 1996 and 1999 Sitka voters approved extending the borough's sales tax base from 4% to 5%. That one percentage point of tax is due to sunset unless extended by an affirmative vote of the people. The sales tax base is being proposed to be kept at 5% in order to maintain a sustainable budget due to reduced state and other funding sources for Sitka, Sitka School District and School Bond Indebtedness obligations. This ballot proposition is in accordance with Ordinance No. 03-1738 which is available for review in its entirety at each polling precinct.

Shall the City and Borough of Sitka maintain a general sales tax with a base rate of five percent all year around in addition to the seasonal sales tax (from April 1 - September 30) of one percentage point approved in March of 2003?
