## VI.UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- IT Update Nothing has changed
- Alaska Library Conference Association scheduled for March 26, 27, 28, 2026
  - Jess reported that the committee is working on a conference theme (leaning toward picking 3 Rs: restore, reground, reboot, reread, rejuvenate) that is uniquely Sitka
  - Already have a block of 75 rooms, planning on 25 more (approximately \$150 night)
  - \$5,000 in seed money, and there is \$1,000 left over from last Sitka conference, money will also come from registration
  - Food ideas include Friends hosting the reception, food trucks for lunches (with a brochure identifying where they are located), dinner,, that attendees pay for but no idea of numbers of attendees yet due to funding issues everywhere (100–150 attendees in the past)
  - Saturday is tentative date for the boat cruise (11-2) with a \$25 cost and maybe include food

- 75 federal IMLS workers were sent home so grant process is on hold
- What are the statutes that IMLS are required to support?
- Lisa Murkowski has written a letter supporting IMLS

- We can call our 2 senators and 1 representative, we can talk to individual Assembly members and we can ask them to take a stand
- Jeff and/or Bruce will chat with Assembly liaisons(Scott and Tim) about the city involvement
- All libraries and state museums are affected by this, as well as some tribes (like STA)

Motion by Gazaway/Budd to send the LC letter regarding this issue to our Congressional delegation Motion passes 5 to 0 by voice vote. (Callie will rewrite the letter and bring it to the next meeting)
