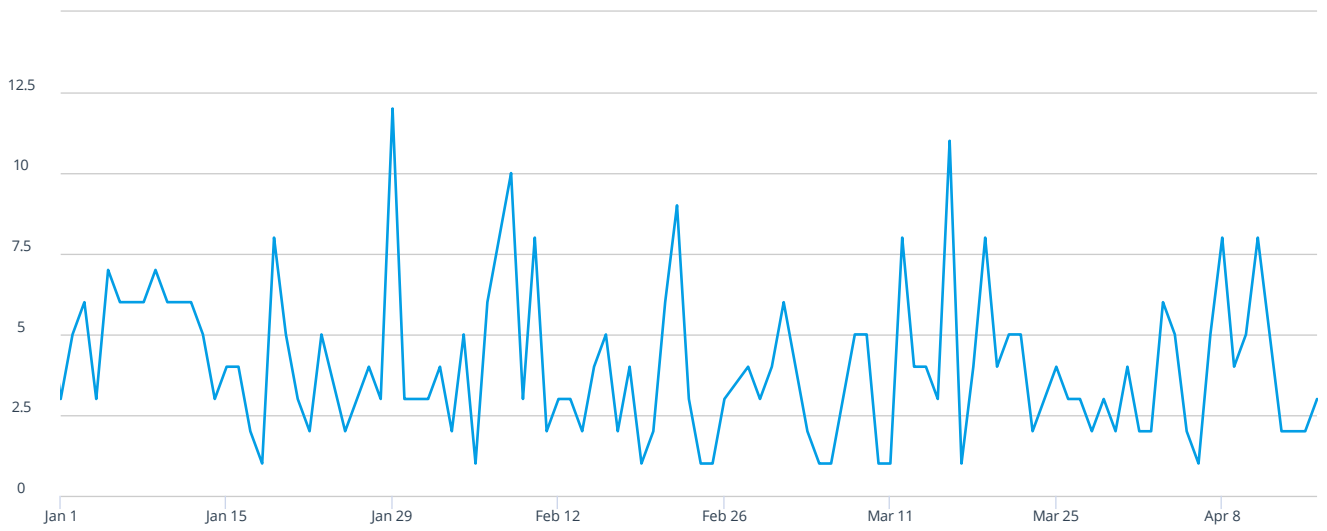

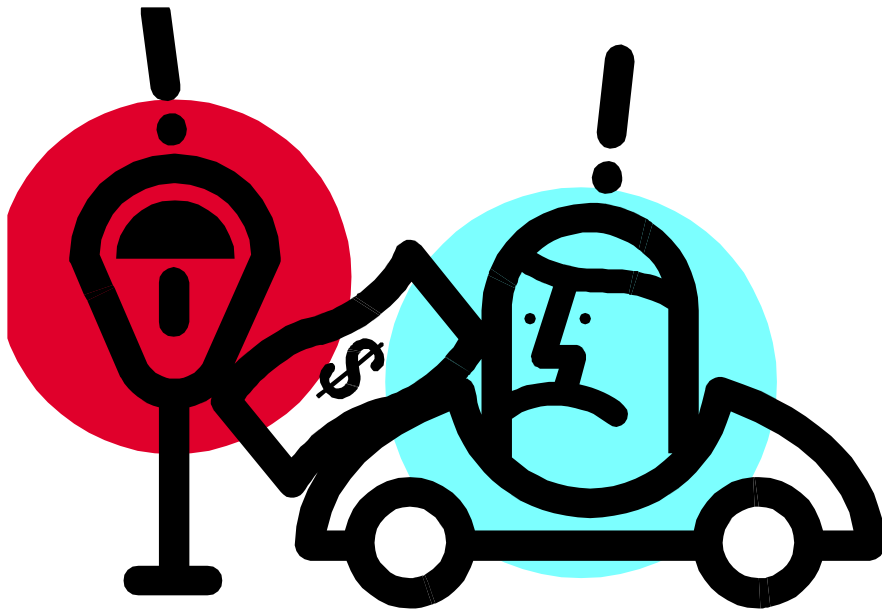

Parking Citation Hearing Board



I move to convene as the Parking Citation
Hearing Board

11.40.090 Parking time limited.

- A. The chief of police is authorized to determine places in which there is public demand or necessity for short-time parking and to designate such places by proper signs indicating the time limit for parking.
- B. When official signs are erected indicating time limit parking in places as authorized herein, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in such designated place for a time longer than indicated on such signs.
- C. When there is public demand or necessity for short-term parking in designated disability zones, the chief of police is authorized to designate locations for such short-term parking and cause proper signs indicating the time limit for parking to be displayed. This time zone shall be no less than two hours. Exceeding this time limit shall be a violation subject to a citation carrying a twenty-five-dollar fine. Any owner of a disability placard or license plate shall abide by all other posted time zones and regulations.

11.40.100 Parking prohibited for extended time period.

- A. No person shall park a vehicle on any street, highway or roadway or on any municipally owned property for a period of time longer than seventy-two hours except in the extended parking areas authorized below.
- B. The assembly may designate certain areas of municipally owned property as extended parking areas. Parking in these areas for longer than seventy-two hours may be allowed under permit issued by the chief of police for such times and under such conditions as may be set through resolution passed by the assembly.
- C. No operator, registered owner, or other person, may park, or allow or cause to be parked in any public street or other public property, any disabled or inoperable motor vehicle for a period to exceed twenty-four hours.

A violation of this subsection will incur a minimum of a twenty-five-dollar fine for each twenty-four-hour period from time of ticketing until the vehicle is permanently removed from public property.

- D. No commercial vehicle or mobile commercial equipment shall be parked upon any street or public property overnight for two consecutive nights within the central business district, Crescent Harbor parking lot, and the Centennial Building parking lot.
- E. No construction vehicle factory-rated above an eight thousand pound gross vehicle weight, or any mobile construction equipment, shall be parked overnight upon any street or public property unless otherwise legally parked in close proximity to a construction or other temporary commercial enterprise on which the equipment is in current use and the daily removal to legal off-street parking would be unfeasible.

Chapter 11.40
STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

11.40.165 Parking vehicles with suspended, revoked, or expired registration on streets, highways, or roadways, or in public parking lots......

No vehicle shall be parked on any street, highway, or roadway or in any public parking lot while displaying a suspended, revoked, or expired registration. (Ord. 04-46 § 4(A), 2004.)

Hearing Officer's Script

1. CALL TO ORDER

This is the time for the hearing on the appeal of Josef Castle. I am Gregg Olson Chair of the Police and Fire Commission, for the City and Borough of Sitka. The Police and Fire Commission is the Hearing Officer as authorized under SGC 11.40.176 for this appeal. Also present is the Police and Fire Commission Secretary, who will make a recording of the hearing.

I have before me a copy of the Request for Administrative Appeal, dated April 3, 2024, requesting a hearing by the Appellant.

2. PRESENTATION OF EVIDENCE

Will the parties attending the hearing please come forward and identify themselves for the record?

The purpose of this hearing is to determine whether the issuance of Citation Number 69158, alleging the violation of No Parking Over 72 Hours did in fact occur. The Appellant will first present their case for issuance of the citation and present evidence on their behalf. The Sitka Police Department will then have an opportunity to respond.

Appellant, please come forward and present your evidence in opposition to the alleged violation.

PD Representative, please come forward and present your evidence in support of the alleged violation.

Does either party have anything further to present at this time?

3. VOTING

The Police and Fire Commission shall now discuss the findings.

Appeal is not granted and the parking violation stands.

The appellant is to pay the fine in the amount of \$25.00, by May 3, 2024.

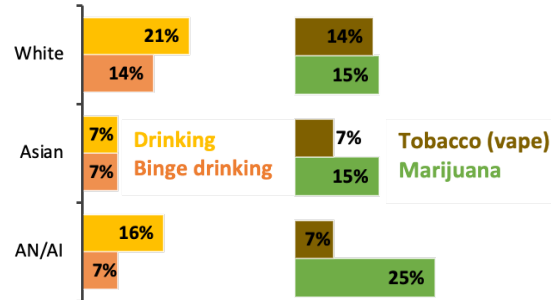

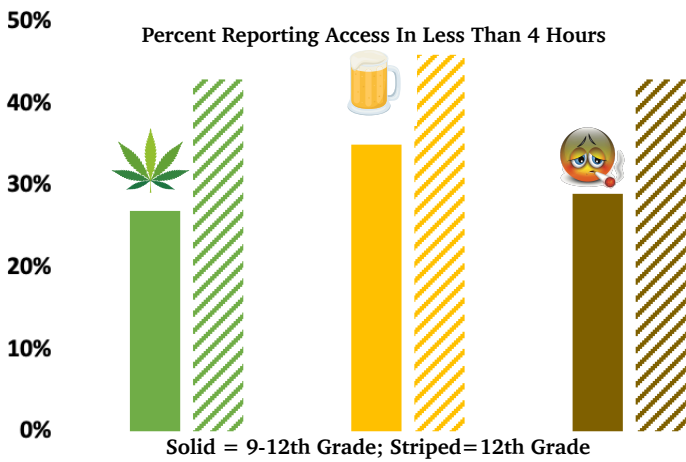

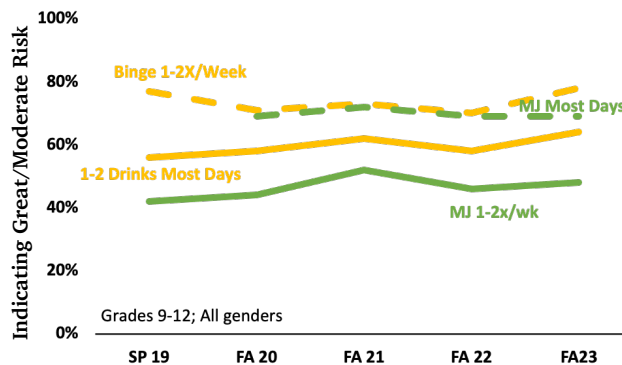

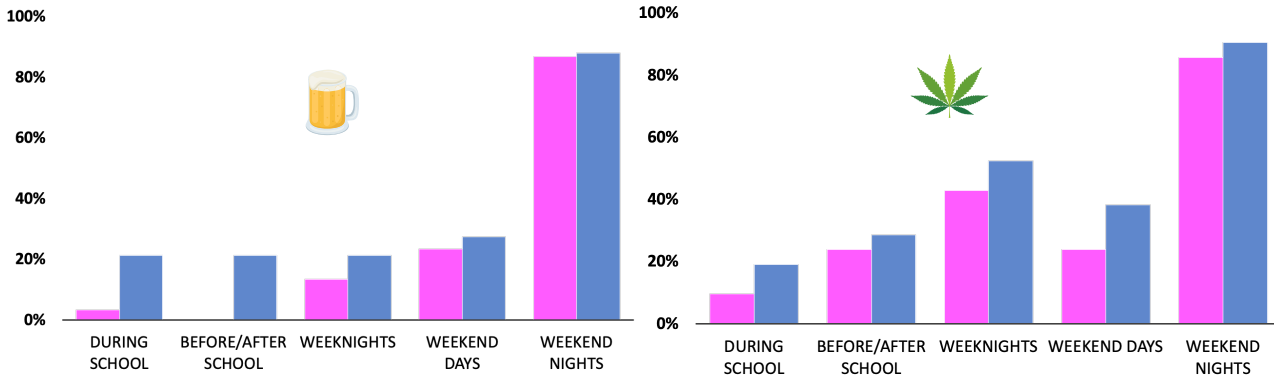

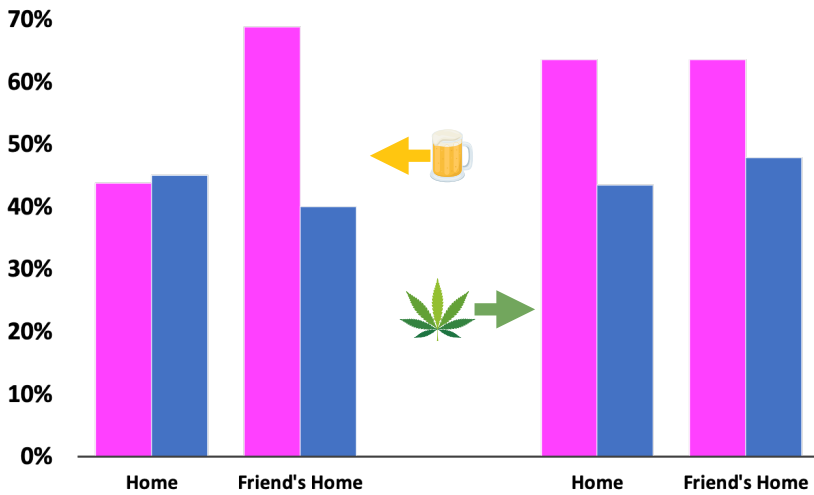

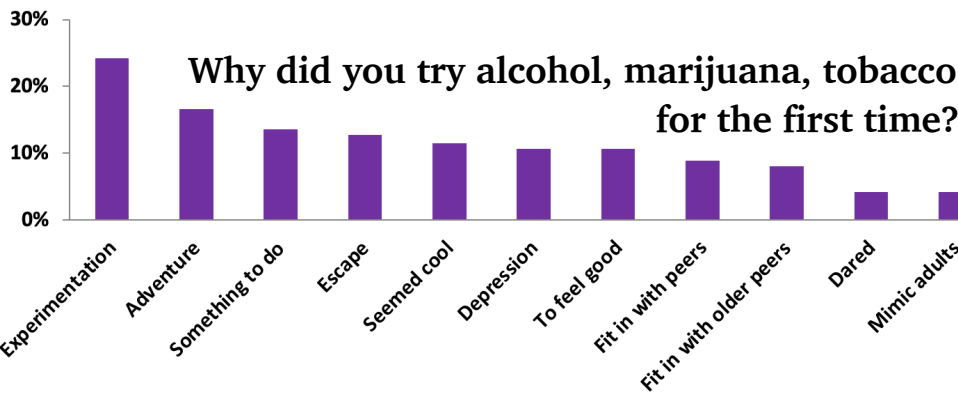

Key Findings: 2023 High School Survey

Overall Trends

- Sitka youth have easy and rapid access to tobacco, alcohol, and marijuana (TAM)
- Generally, females use tobacco, alcohol, and marijuana at higher rates than do males
- Based on self-reported alcohol and marijuana use, class of 2024 is a high use cohort
- Using marijuana 1-2x/week is perceived as lower risk than using other substances
- Fall 2023 senior rates of use are 6.1 (vaping tobacco), 5.7 (drinking), and 4.5 (using marijuana) times higher than current freshman rates of use

Access to TAM

- Percentage of HS students reporting easy access to TAM has been increasing since 2021
- Over 50% of HS students report access to TAM as “easy”
- Approximately 1/3 of Fall 2023 Seniors report being able to access TAM within 2 hours

Alcohol Use

- 18% and 12% of HS students report drinking and binge drinking, respectively, in past 30 days
- 38% (female) and 20% (male) of HS seniors report binge drinking in the past 30 days
- Despite higher use rates, HS females perceive drinking as being higher risk than do males

Marijuana Use

- 17% of high schoolers (38% of seniors) report using marijuana in the past 30 days.
- 25% of HS seniors view using marijuana as wrong/very wrong compared to 80% of HS freshmen
- Smoking remains the most common method of marijuana use

Tobacco Use

- Vaping rate is 2 times higher than rates for either smoking tobacco or using smokeless tobacco
- Rates of smoking tobacco among high school juniors and seniors appears to be increasing
- Smoking tobacco is becoming more accepted among high school seniors

Risk of Harm

- 23% of high school seniors reported marijuana use as carrying great/moderate risk.
- High risk of harm of using tobacco is consistent across Sitka youth.

Peer and Parental Disapproval

- Peers are perceived as being more approving of substance use than parents/guardians
- Generally, peer approval increases from 9th to 12th grade
- High schoolers tend to perceive peer use of marijuana more permissively than alcohol

Key Findings: 2023 Middle School Survey

Overall Trends

- Sitka youth having easy and rapid access to tobacco, alcohol, and marijuana (TAM)
- Despite easy/rapid access, use rates for TAM among Sitka middle schoolers remains low

Access to TAM

- Approximately 30% of middle school respondents report “easy” access to alcohol
- Alcohol is considered more easily and readily accessible than other substances

Substance Use

- Overall use rates are very low among Sitka middle school-age youth
- Use trends are similar for alcohol, marijuana, and electronic nicotine products
- Vaping (tobacco) is more common than smoking tobacco, but rates are low
- Approximately 2% of respondents report drinking alcohol or using marijuana in past 30 days

Risk of Harm

- Since the inception of the survey (Fall 2021), middle school students consistently consider marijuana use as less harmful than using other substances
- Using alcohol, tobacco products, or misusing prescriptions medications are perceived as having similar risk

Peer and Parental Disapproval

- Peers are perceived as being more approving of substance use than are parents/guardians
- Student disapproval of peer of alcohol and marijuana use are similar (approximately 80%)

Substance Use Survey: Youth

- SUSY is a locally developed and administered anonymous survey of youth regarding access to substances, substance use attitudes, and behaviors
- SUSY represents 2 surveys – a high school and a middle school survey
- The survey aligns with national guidelines and information collection strategies
- Customized to address Sitka-specific issues to inform substance use prevention efforts
- The surveys are administered by Sitka Counseling, Inc. each fall in cooperation with Sitka High School and Blatchley Middle School staff
- State- and national-level surveys restrict access of data to small communities – SUSY is a local survey without these restrictions
- Sitka Counseling incentivizes participation by contributing to activity funds for each grade level that participates
- School personnel DO NOT have access to raw data, participant identification
