### PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Project was initiated in 2011 to link Sitka National Historical Park to the cruise ship docks as a dedicated pedestrian route
- To become a community destination and waterfront showcase

Designed for visitors and locals



# PHASES OF PREVIOUS WORK

- 2011: Route master planning with community
- 2012: Phase 1: Permitting and 65% engineering and design
- 2012: National Park Service (NPS) segment removed from project
- 2013: Phase 1: Final construction documents
- 2013: Phase 1: Completed and opened
- 2020: NPS Segment: Initiates design on segment to reach visitor center
- 2021: Phase 2: Planning initiated (MOA signed)
- 2022: NPS Segment: Construction documents completed
- 2023: NPS Segment: Estimated construction start




PHASE 2 SEAWALK

- Project extends Seawalk from Library to Lincoln Street/Totem Square and would complete Seawalk
- Phase 2 received Federal Lands Access
   Program funding in 2014
- FLAP funding approved for acceptance by City and Borough of Sitka (CBS) via resolution 2014-5
- Project is consistent with numerous City plans
- MOA signed in 2021 to allow use of ADOT&PF right-of-way for Seawalk and maintenance by CBS
- Current plan is to construct in 3
   distinct sections, with section 2 first
   (blue colored)



# DESIGN SCOPING COMPLETED



- Two scoping reports performed in coordination with Western Federal Lands and the CBS, 2019 – 2020.
- Report 1: Scoped and estimated costs for all sections. Presented three alternatives for Section 2.
- Fill alternative (top image) found to likely be most cost effective.
- Report 2 focused on Section 2 fill alternative as first project and refined the scope and estimate.
- Funding shortfall was identified in scoping documents.
- Recommended additional design to understand costs=Preliminary design

PRELIMINARY DESIGN


- Topographical and bathymetric surveys completed
- Completed Wind and Wave Analysis
  - Significant wave potential, large armor required.
  - Established Seawalk elevation
  - Established slope to minimize footprint



# SECTION 1

- Replace concrete sidewalks along Harbor Drive to 8-foot wide
- Loss of four parking stalls (6-foot wide paved shoulder)
- Relocated crosswalk






# SECTION 2

- Seawalk over fill with armor slope
- Four overlooks
- Pedestrian safety and security lighting
- No guardrails
- Landscaped edge with boulders







# SECTION 3

- Concrete sidewalk along Harbor Way replaced by Seawalk
- Looking for feedback on Lincoln intersection
- Alternative Seawalk route on waterside of parking lot











# ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

- Environmental review is currently in process, NEPA documentation anticipated as a Categorical Exclusion (CE)
- National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) Endangered Species Act consultation to occur for fill placement in the intertidal area
- Essential Fish Habitat (EFH) consultation to occur for fill placement in the intertidal area
- Eelgrass survey was conducted in August 2022
- No in-water work window from mid-March to April
- Section 106 Consultation to occur for compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act
- Permits to be obtained: USACE Permit
- Environmental Timeline: NEPA Document (CE) completion anticipated in Spring 2023



# ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW





### ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

- Four on-street parking spaces will be lost along Harbor Drive.
- Safety and Security: Lighting will be installed that are dark skies compliant, low glare fixtures
- No 'hightide' paver pattern, replaced by colored concrete band. Pattern may be included in walls at overlooks
- Fill will be placed as part of Section 2 and will impact eelgrass bed
- Alternative route through Section 3, preference?
- Section 2 surface alternatives funding dependent





# NEXT STEPS

Comment period open through December 30, 2022. Comments will shape design and provide insight for NEPA

75% design for Section 2 in spring 2023 with public meeting

NEPA for Phase 2 and final design for Section 2 completed in summer 2023

Secure additional funding through summer 2023

Section 2 out to bid in late summer 2023 and construction completed summer 2024

Secure funding for Sections 1 and 3, begin design/engineering, construction. TBD

Updates and notifications will be posted on project website
